

ZEAD RAMADAN A product of Washington Heights, Zead Ramadan has always advocated for the arts in his Northern Manhattan communities. Through his leadership and advocacy during his tenure as chair of WaHI Community Board 12 (2002-2004), the Uptown Arts Stroll was born. As the CB12 representative on the Upper Manhattan Empowerment Zone board of directors, he helped secure over \$1.2M in funding leading to the creation of the umbrella arts organization to serve artists and arts groups, later known as the Northern Manhattan Arts Alliance ("NoMAA") now in its 17th year. As NoMAA's founding chairperson, Zead helped bring together a formerly disconnected arts scene; created grants opportunities



for individual artists and arts organizations; helped open galleries; was awarded prestigious prizes from the National Endowment of the Arts and Union Square Arts; and assumed the management of the Uptown Arts Stroll, now in its 22nd year. Zead often says that he is most proud of the first resolution he passed as community board chair, which demanded that all tax-funded NYC maps include Washington Heights and Inwood, ensuring that our beautiful arts institutions were forever represented.



VERONICA SANTIAGO LIU is a writer, editor, bookseller, and arts organizer. She is a founder and the general coordinator of the 40-person collective that operates Word Up Community Bookshop/Librería Comunitaria, which started as a pop-up at the Uptown Arts Stroll 13 years ago, and Recirculation, which started 3.5 years ago as a community book and music space to honor a former Word Up collective member who passed away from COVID. Veronica has cofounded an online radio station and a micropress, and has received individual grants for writing, the development of an arts and music fair, a video series, and various publishing projects. She is currently an editor-at-large at Seven Stories Press, where she worked as managing then senior editor for more than a decade. Her writing, comics, and photography have been published in *Broken Pencil, Mom Egg, Quick Fiction, In/Context*, and other journals and zines.

RAFAELA GÓMEZ LUNA (AKA Rafaela Luna) is a Dominicanborn multidisciplinary artist and educator. She moved to NYC in July 2012 with a bachelor's degree in Advertising, Creativity and Management from The Autonomous University of Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic. She earned her master's degree in Art Education from City College and holds a Certification in Cultural Management and Development, AEICID-CCE, and an Associate's in Visual Arts from The National School of Fine Arts of Santo Domingo with a specialization in painting. In 2021, she earned an



associate degree in Publicity Art from the Autonomous University of Santo Domingo where she was also a fellow recipient of the DEAR-CCCADI prize. In 2023, Luna served as a Mentor for the Immigrant Artist Program of New York Foundation for the Arts, NY sharing her experiences as an artist with the immigrant artist community.



SARINA PRABASI is a native of Nepal, spening her formative years in India, China, the United States and Ethiopia. In 2011 Sarina and husband Elias moved from Addis Ababa to Washington Heights, and founded Buunni Coffee. Prior to Buunni, Sarina had a career in international development, including serving as the CEO of WaterAid America, and Deputy Chief of Programs for Orbis International. Sarina's memoir, *The Coffeehouse Resistance*, delves into the history of coffee houses as sites of community building and activism, and charts her family's move from Ethiopia to New York. Sarina has served on the boards of the Specialty Coffee Association, the People's Theatre Project, and Helvetas.

CAMILLE JOSEPH-GOLDMAN is the Group Vice President for Charter Communications, where she oversees government affairs in the northeastern United States from Harlem to Bangor, Maine. Previously, she worked in government for more than a decade, serving as U.S. Senator Kirsten Gillibrand's Special Advisor & Director of Intergovernmental Affairs. She was appointed New York City's youngest Deputy Comptroller for Public Affairs. Camille got her start in politics serving as a field organizer for then-Senator Barack Obama and later went on to become a Deputy Director on President Obama's 2012 reelection campaign. Camille is deeply



committed to the communities she works in and has the pleasure of proudly serving on the board of the National Action Network, Buffalo Niagara Partnership, The Lower Eastside Girls Club, Eleanor's Legacy and as a trustee for the Citizen's Budget Commission of New York City.

1. GEORGE WASHINGTON BRIDGE

One of the most spectacular bridges in the five boroughs—and one of the busiest bridges in the world—this two-story, 14-lane structure was opened in 1931, with a lower level added in 1962. Dubbed the GWB by commuters, this suspension bridge—where New Yorkers head to Jersey and vice versa over the Hudson River —is always chock-full o' cars, trucks, bikes and pedestrians. The Little Red Lighthouse, officially Jeffrey's Hook Light, is a small lighthouse located in Fort Washington Park along the Hudson River in Upper Manhattan under the George Washington Bridge It was made notable by the 1942 children's book The Little Red Lighthouse and The Great Gray Bridge, written by Hildegarde Swift and illustrated by Lynn Ward. 3. THE UNITED PALACE

The United Palace is a theater located at 4140 Broadway in Washington Heights, New York City. Built in 1930 as one of Loew's "Wonder Theatres," the United Palace was one of the region's premier vaudeville and movie houses. With more than 3,000 seats, it is still the fourth largest venue of its kind in Manhattan.

4. J. HOOD WRIGHT PARK J. Hood Wright Park is named for the former owner of the site. Wright (1836-1894), a wealthy banker and financier from Philadelphia, lived in a mansion at 175th Street and Haven Avenue. He made large anonymous contributions to what is now the Washington Heights Branch of the New York Public Library.

5. BENNETT PARK

Bennett Park is named for James Gordon Bennett (1795-1872), who purchased the land that is now the park in 1871. Bennett was a the prominent newspaper publisher and editor who is widely recognized as a pioneer of American popular journalism. Bennett Park occupies the highest natural point in Manhattan, 265.05 feet above sea level.





7. INWOOD HILL PARK

9. DYCKMAN FARMHOUSE





11. NIKE TRACK & FIELD CENTER AT THE ARMORY

The Armory has had a special place in New York City for over 100 years. Built originally to house local units of the state's volunteer militia and later the National Guard, The Armory later became the hub for the city's track and field enthusiasts. The track was recently renamed the Nike Track & Field Center at The Armory.


15. MORRIS JUMEL MANSION

The American Academy of Arts and Letters was founded in 1898 as an honor society of the country's leading architects, artists, composers, and writers. Early members include William Merritt Chase, Childe Hassam, Julia Ward Howe, Henry James, Edward MacDowell, Theodore Roosevelt, Augustus Saint-Gaudens, John Singer Sargent, and Mark Twain.

21. RIVERSIDE PARK

Stretching four miles from 72nd to 158th streets along the Hudson River, Riverside Park is widely regarded as Manhattan's most spectacular waterfront park Recreational facilities include a range of sports courts and fields, a skate park, a large portion of the Manhattan Waterfront Greenway (for bicycles).



26. FORT TRYON PARK

Fort Tryon Park is home to Manhattan's largest dog run, complete with a gazebo for dog owners to sit and socialize, as well as two playgrounds, volleyball courts, and built-in ping pong tables. The pristine views of the Hudson River make the park the perfect setting for exploring, meandering strolls, and picnics.

28. TRINITY CHURCH CEMETERY

Trinity Church Cemetery and Mausoleum is one of the few active burial sites in Manhattan. It is listed on the National Register of Historic places and is the burial place of notable people including John James Audubon, John Jacob Astor IV, Mayor Edward I. Koch, Governor John Adams Dix, Ralph Ellison, and Eliza Jumel. Trinity Church Cemetery and Mausoleum es uno de los pocos lugares de entierro activos en Manhattan. Está incluido en el Registro Nacional de lugares históricos y es el lugar de entierro de personas notables, incluidos John James Audubon, John Jacob Astor IV, el alcalde Edward I. 
29. FORT WASHINGTON PARK

Fort Washington Park is a public park located in the Washington Heights section of Upper Manhattan in New York City. Located along the Hudson River, Fort Washington Park also offers spectacular views of the new Jersey Palisades and the George Washington Bridge along its 160-acre ribbon of dramatic cliffs, meadows, and wooded areas. It lies along the Harlem River with an urban forest, saltwater marsh & an array of wildlife.
